III. DEQ- Twin Falls Regional Update

An update on the state budget was given. The state monitoring budget has been cut about 80% for the next fiscal year. The Twin Falls Office is looking for other options to do water quality monitoring; like using the Hydrolab; or site assessment; and possibly other agency data.

DEQ now has the WAG information on their website. As of now, anyone can get updates with the WAG information from the website. The meeting time, agendas, and minutes will be posted on the website and calendar.

DEQ has been working with The Department of Fish and Game to prevent the invasion of invasive species. Both agencies have been placing Quagga and Zebra Mussel traps in the watersheds. So far,

DEQ has placed the traps in Salmon Falls Creek, Magic Reservoir, Milner, Lake Walcott, in Neely, American Falls, Centennial Park, and at Owsley Bridge.

Katie talked with the WAG members about their membership responsibilities; Title 39- Health and Safety. The WAG is responsible for recommending those specific actions needed to control point and nonpoint sources of pollution; they have to consult the director and participate in the development of each TMDL; and they shall cooperate fully with the public involvement or planning processes of other appropriate public agencies. She also told them about the WAG survey, that she had sent out to them. DEQ would like for the members to fill out the survey and send it back into the Regional Office. The survey will help DEQ to understand and work with the members better.

The group discussed the time and day in which to have WAG meetings. The consensus was to keep the meeting at night for the folks that work during the day, and every 4th, Thursday of the month. It was decided to only have 2 or 3 meetings a year, unless something important came up.

IV. 319 Project Update

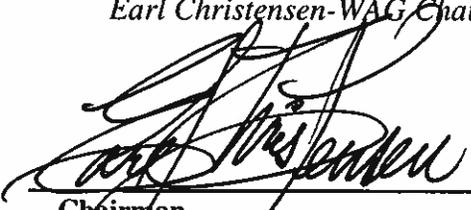
