Moose Drool Planting Project



When: SATURDAY JUNE 13 2015, 8:30 AM

Where: Little North Fork Coeur d'Alene River, Iron Creek.

PLEASE BRING: GLOVES, SHOVEL OR OTHER DIGGING TOOLS. Some planting tools will be available. **Attendees need to bring CHAIRS for seating during lunch.** We will be planting rain or shine so please bring appropriate clothing and boots.

Activities: We will be working in the Upper Little North Fork CDA River on Iron Creek. This area is about 1 mile above the Horse Haven landing strip on forest road 794. We will be planting trees and shrubs on rehabilitated roads along Iron Creek. This is part of the Moose Drool Watershed Restoration Project to restore the native cutthroat trout fisheries in the Upper Little North Fork CDA River. We will be planting in the morning, from 0830 to 1230. We will have water at the work site. A barbeque of hamburgers and hot dogs will be provided. The club will also provide chips, salads, drinks (soft drinks) and water. After lunch there will be a short presentation by the U.S. Forest Service on the Moose Drool Project and the success that these types of projects have had on the rehabilitation the Coeur D'Alene River. We will also have a presentation by Jim Ekins University of Idaho area water educator on the Idaho H2O program.
