

# Learn About Hazardous Products In Your Home



## Read Labels - Look for Signal Words

Signal words are found on labels of many different products, although older products may not list these words.

Drugs and personal care products can be hazardous, but not all are required to have signal words.

Signal Words
Poison
Danger
Warning
Caution

*Reduce Hazardous Products In Your Home:* Shop smart. Buy the least hazardous product you can find. When shopping, read the product label carefully to learn about product uses and dangers before you buy.

*Buy Only What You Need:* Purchase only what you can use completely so you don't have to worry about storage or disposal.

*Practice Safe Disposal:* If you have unwanted hazardous products that you are not able to use or give away, dispose of them responsibly. Many products should be taken to a household hazardous waste collection site.
